Installation

Important: Please use the installation procedure below. Improper or no operation may result if the start-up sequence is not correctly followed.

Step 1

Carefully unpack the contents of the shipping group.

Step 2

Plug directly the To Video Source(Tx) module of HDC cable in the HDMI receptacle of HDMI video source. Do **NOT** use any intermediate cable or adapter between them. This may deteriorate the signal quality.

Step 3

Plug the To Display(Rx) module of HDC cable in the HDMI receptacle of the display. Do **NOT** use any intermediate cable or adapter between them. This may deteriorate the signal quality.

Step 4

Power on the devices of HDMI video source and the display.




Figure 2 - Tx Module of HDC HDMI Cable

Step 5

Check, if video and audio work properly.

Note: HDC cable can use the +5V power supplied through a HDMI pin (#18) from the HDMI source. If the system doesn't work properly, you have to confirm the power capable to supply more than 500mA.




Figure 3 - Rx Module of HDC HDMI Cable

Step 6

If there is no video or audio, connect a +5V AC/DC power adapter to Tx module of HDC cable.

<u>Note:</u> In some cases, the HDMI sources do not supply sufficiently DC powers for HDC cable. Therefore, HDX may require a external +5V AC/DC power adaptor to drive the Tx/Rx modules. The power from the Tx module is delivered to the Rx module via built-in hybrid cable. Therefore, powering the Tx module is sufficient.

Step 5

Check again, if the systems work properly. If not, go to page 1-5, trouble shooting

1-4 Installation (continued)

Troubleshooting

The display displays only black screen.

Ensure that all AC and DC plugs and jacks used by external power supplies are firmly connected.

Ensure that the HDMI ports are firmly plugged in to the HDMI source/PC and display. Ensure that the Tx and Rx modules are plugged in correctly to the HDMI source/PC and display.

Check if the HDMI source/PC and display are powered on and properly booted.

Reset the system by de-plugging and re-plugging the Tx HDMI port or Rx HDMI port, or by de-plugging and re-plugging the power cord plugs of Tx module.

Re-boot up the video source while the display is on.

Screen is distorted or displays noises.

Check if the graphic resolution is properly set. Go to the display properties of TV / Windows and tap the settings. Ensure that the resolution sets less than 1080p / WUXGA (1,920x1,200) at 60Hz refresh ratio.

Reset the system. Disconnect and reconnect the optical HDMI cables or DC power adapters.

Maintenance

No special maintenance is required for the optical HDMI cables and power supplies. Ensure that the cables and power modules are stored or used in a benign environment free from liquid or dirt contamination.

There are no user serviceable parts. Refer all service and repair issues to Dtrovision tech support.

□ Hardware requirements

- You have to have a HDMI / DVI multimedia systems (DVD, AV Receiver, STB etc.) or graphic cards. It should support the maximum graphic resolution feature of displays to be connected.
- No special requirements in memory size, CPU speed and chipsets, if you've already properly installed your HDMI systems or DVI graphic cards.

□ Software requirements

No special requirements, if your HDMI / DVI systems is properly installed.

□ AC/DC Power Adapter Technical Advisory

The HDC cable is designed to use +5V internal power supplied via HDMI pin (#18) / DVI pin (#14) from the graphic source port. However, if the video source does not output sufficient power, the HDC cable requires one external +5V AC/DC power adaptor to drive the Tx/Rx modules. The power for Rx module is supplied over the hybrid cable built into the fiber optic cable.

Tips: In some cases, HD sources does not provide sufficient DC powers for the HDC cable.




Figure 1 - PureLink HDC Optical HDMI extension Cable
